This incident was made famous with a drawing done by Clifford Berryman, a political cartoonist. Roosevelt said yes, and the rest is history!



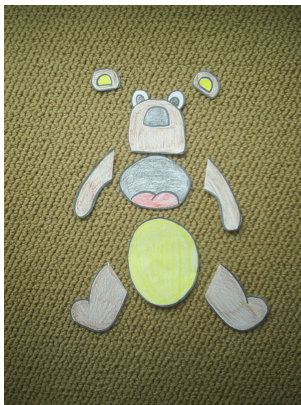
Materials:
